<p>4. The purpose of processing personal data (purpose of register)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Application for a domain name with the country code top-level domain (ccTLD) extension of .fi - Section 15 of the Domain Name Act. 	
<p>5. Contents of the register (a description of the data groups)</p>	<p>Domain name information</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Domain name, domain name status, date of application, date of issue and date of expiry. <p>Contact information of the domain name holder</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - For companies/organisation: the form of the company/organisation, business ID/register number and the name of the enterprise/department. - For private individuals: first name, middle name(s) and last name. - For all domain name holders: mailing address, postal code, post office branch and telephone number. Private individuals have the right to forbid domain name holders from entering the mailing address, postal code, post office branch and telephone number from their contact information in the domain name register. <p>Domain name server information</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The names, IP addresses and status of the name servers. <p>Contact information for the technical administrator of the domain name</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - When the technical administrator is a company/organisation: the name of the company/organisation and the enterprise/department. - When the technical administrator is a private individual: first 	

	<p>name, middle name(s) and last name. - For all technical administrators: mailing address, postal code, post office branch and telephone number.</p>
<p>6. Regular sources of data</p>	<p>The domain name holder, his or her trustee, representative and the provider of domain name services.</p>
<p>7. Regular disclosures of data and the transfer of data outside of the EU or the EEA</p>	<p>Information can be electrically delivered from the domain name register and through the public information network. FICORA maintains an information service on the Internet that allows the public to access information on domain names, their holders, contact information for the holders, domain name servers, technical administrators and contact information for the administrators.</p> <p>Otherwise, personal data is disclosed if the data subject so consents to it, in accordance with the provisions of the Act on the Openness of Government Activities or separate provisions on the right to access data.</p>
<p>8. The principles of register protection</p>	<p>A. Manual material The register is maintained using automatic data processing.</p> <p>B. Processed data An information service is maintained on the Internet that allows the public to access the data mentioned in section 7.</p> <p>The rights to access and change the processed data in the register is entrusted to those employees of FICORA that need the data in order to be able to do their jobs. These rights are protected with usernames, passwords and permission for certain groups and operations.</p> <p>The holder of the domain name or his/her representative has, through the Internet, access to the holder's processed data files, which can be changed by the holder/representative. The holder, or his or her representative, is identified by a user name, a password and an authorisation key. The connection formed by a domain name holder or his or her representative is encrypted with SSL.</p>
<p>9. Right of access (Personal Data Act, sections 26–28)</p>	<p>Domain name holders, or their representatives, may check their data in the register via Internet at any time, free of charge.</p> <p>The right of access in accordance with the Personal Data Act: - Everyone has the right to verify his or her personal data in the register as stipulated in sections 26–28 of the Personal Data Act. - The request for access shall be made personally or by a personally signed letter addressed to FICORA.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The identity of the person using the right of access is certified when accessing confidential data. - If so requested, the data to be accessed can be provided as a hard copy. - In case access is refused, a written certificate to this effect will be provided. - The right of access may be used free of charge once (1) a year.
<p>10. Rectification (section 29 of the Personal Data Act)</p>	<p>Domain name holders, or their representatives, may check their data in the register via Internet at any time, free of charge and change them, where necessary.</p> <p>Rectification according to the Personal Data Act:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Erroneous register data is rectified at the request of the data subject as stipulated in section 29 of the Personal Data Act. - The identity of the person requested rectification is verified when necessary. - The request to rectify erroneous data must be unambiguous. - The request for rectification of erroneous data shall be addressed to FICORA. - If erroneous data will not be rectified, a written certificate to this effect will be provided.

The description also includes the necessary information for the data subject in accordance with section 24 of the Personal Data Act.
